Government poised to legislate get out of jail free card.

Government is getting closer to moving the Amendment Bill to the committee stage and to its final reading.

Once passed the income from the discipline levy and the prosecutions fee become legal, but worse than that their expenditure also becomes legal, so even if it had nothing to do with discipline they still can't be held accountable.

How much expenditure is has been collected for discipline and prosecutions but spent on other items that aren't cost arising out of investigations? We estimate it is over a million dollars so what the government is saying is "hope you had a good spend up its all legal now".

Secondly remove yourself from the Board's electronic mailing list. You can do this by simply sending an email to comms@pgdb.co.nz stating: "Please remove me from the Electronic Mailing list" and then include your details, or if you can't be bothered contacting the Board simply mark their emails as spam. (We favour letting them know – if they get a huge number of practitioners that remove themselves from the mailing list it may just force some action from their part).

If you chose to read the Boards propaganda you can always log on to their web site. There is no law saying we have to do everything electronically.

The Board goes on all the time about "implied responsibilities" and what the "intent of the Act" is. They have their legislated responsibilities but there are also a number of implied responsibilities such as communicating with the industry and ensuring New Zealand has sufficient trades people to service and keep the public safe.

It is time for industrial action so we will ease ourselves into the fray with this minor electronic protest - so rather than them taking it as normal that their emails get through, perhaps they should re-think it the fact that their propaganda will not be read by industry

As students we have all been hit this year with a small but none the less new charge for trainee licenses by the PGDB which will make it harder for people to get apprenticeships/trainee licenses.

My classmates & I had not heard of the PGDF until the recent media coverage but it has been the talk of tech.

This year we had all written a collective signed letter of complaint to the tech as our training fees increased considerably this year while the practical on campus course time itself was cut down by over 3 weeks! "buying points" part of it, which would cost me, but I'm not going to pay that either anyway because its plain extortion dressed up as bullshit.

They don't care in the least if we have to charge our clients extra to pay for all these costs for courses and crippling compliance costs, they don't care what lengths we have to go to or what financial hardship they put businesses and customers through just to break even.

Plumbing World has given no support to the Federation and we can't help but think they are walking on dangerous ground biting the hands that feed them. Shame they haven't shown as much interest in their customers and the plight they are experiencing with the regulatory Board. (Mind you maybe they have some member's in common?)

By now no doubt you would have had numerous stories from plumbers who are simply peeved off with the plumber's board and their mates at the beehive!

Your story today highlights the problem we have. The prosecutions mentioned are typical of so called plumbers who I would venture to say are new to this country and come here to NZ with either dodgy qualifications or those not up to our standard. When they can't get a job without their "ticket " they sometimes resort to " OK I'll give it a go myself " being ably assisted by the helpful advice for DIYers from the likes of Bunning's or Mitre 10 Mega but then occasionally by a stuff up or ignorance come to the attention of the plumbers board who then prosecute that person (courtesy of fees paid by legit plumbers)

The plumbers board then proclaim how they are doing a great job getting rid of these cowboys and protecting the health of the public!

I have been a registered plumber and drainlayer for the past 44 years and paying my annual license fees to a board who would now deem me to be a cowboy if I didn't attend " upskilling courses " to gain points so as to renew my annual license . Over these past decades I , amongst all other plumbers , have kept up with latest developments etc in the industry and managed very well to keep up to date with industry developments otherwise I would be still installing galvanised pipe and lead waste pipes These upskilling courses, according to this plumbers board, are more important than my qualifications and experience for without these points I am a mere cowboy ! The so called upskilling courses are mostly where the provider sees the opportunity to promote their own products. I also fail to see the benefit of a drainlayer attending a course on instantaneous gas water heaters in order to get the "points ".

There is also legislation so that it is illegal for any individual or firm to employ a person to undertake plumbing work knowing that the person does not have the qualifications to do so.

I have never heard of the plumber's board enforcing this or ever targeting the firms promoting DIY to the real cowboys where the problem really lies.

The plumber's board may have the public and Maurice Williamson believing them but any plumber that knows how this board who (claim to be a charity) is spending their fee money knows otherwise!
