The Government admits it's been charging most van and Ute owners too much - (an extra \$150.00 per year) - for ACC when they register their vehicles. ACC has potentially collected around \$150 million in levies it shouldn't have.

But the Government says that doesn't constitute a "mistake". We estimate the legalised theft has taken \$4,260,000.00 from just OUR industry over the last four years.

Plumbers Gasfitters and Drainlayers Amendment Bill Update



Thursday last week, the House started the Third reading of the Plumbers Gasfitters and Drainlayers Bill so you can take it that the Bill will be passed. We assume that Flip Flop was too ashamed to go to the third reading, and so got Anne Tolley to do the reading from a set script on his behalf. They are claiming the Amendment actions put in place was what was intended by Parliament, but what proof have they come up with to say the prosecution's fee was what was intended? None as far as we can ascertain.

Even at this final third reading stage the lies are coming thick and fast. Ms Tolley stated "Overall the validation of these fees and levies was the most practicable and cost effective option because the money has been spent on investigations and prosecutions", well what a load of shite. The House is now in recess for the school holidays and the third reading should resume on the next sitting day 30 July 2013. After that we will lobby the Governor General regarding our rights being legislated away by the Government of the day. The Passing of the Bill will make history in New Zealand whereby a Registered Charity is given the power to impose a tax on the people of New Zealand. This was sent to one of the papers as a letter to the Editor and we are hopeful it will be published.

Government changes the law to allow Government appointed Charity Board to impose prosecutions tax.

It may seem like a farfetched story that a Registered Charity is given the power to tax citizens of New Zealand but that's what is happening. Approximately 7100 trades' people who are forced to pay fees to the Plumbers Gasfitters and Drainlayers Board, a Registered Charity, are now being taxed so this "Registered Charity" can prosecute unregistered people who elect to do sanity plumbing gasfitting and drainlaying. Yes 7100 trades

"There is a better regime, which is coming into force, so there hasn't been overcharging," says Ms Collins. 
was described to us:

The successful failure continues, yes we are talking about the new Gas Certificate Regime designed by Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment (MoBIE). This gas certificate regime is not about safety at all, it's about money and the Government looking good, but the way they cover themselves

The recent meeting to discuss the Gas Certification Regime in Lower Hutt saw 40 gasfitters attend, with no points, no beer and no pizza on offer. Gasfitters are feeling they have been "dumped in the deep end" and are now truly doing it for themselves to quote the words of a song. In fact ESS's advice to two gasfitters that contacted them was to "red the Regulations and take them to your lawyer for advice..." This week a meeting was held in Wellington hosted by a prominent Master Plumber's member where it was discussed forming a Prosecution Support Group. It is anticipated anyone who is contacted by the Board regarding discipline issues would contact the support group and seek advice, assistance and peer review of the case. Members of the group will need to be experienced tradespeople who are prepared to go to discipline hearings in defence of fellow trades people. The Federation believes it is an excellent idea and will be supporting it as much as possible.

In addition the Federation is also thinking along the same lines with the formation of a national shadow "Board" who will be elected by the industry and will review the decisions made by the PGD Board and Minister and report on the impact on the industry. This will provide effective governance of the industry for industry. Let us know what you think? We would see the "Board" being made up of ten representatives of industry (from one man bands to larger companies, from apprentices to certifiers).

Copies of Gas Certificates; Charge for them?

We note in the Regulations that Gas Safety Certificates and Certificates of Compliance must be supplied upon request to:

- · the Secretary
- · the Board
- · the Registrar
- the territorial authority of the place where the gas installation is located
- But just because they work for the the person who contracted for the work to be done
 - the owner or occupier of the place or thing in which the gas installation or part installation is located.

We believe you CAN charge for the certificates as you are the owner and you will incur costs in the recovery of the documents from your archives, copying and postage. In this world of user pays then it is reasonable to impose a cost.

The Board have set the precedent with the imposition of a fee for the recovery of gas certificates from archives so it is only fair we do the same. They had a system where they had all the relevant information which has been dumped by the regulations.

If we don't impose a charge then yet again we are working for free.

If you are in favour the Federation is happy to draft up a letter of notification to the relevant organisations for you to send, warning them of the charges. We can still meet our legislative responsibilities by supplying the documentation by the required time lines. If the organisations fail to pay then they will become a bad debtor the same as anyone else.
