Cash jobs aren't tax free income



Do you have too much money in your wallet from doing cashies? If this is a problem for you then you are taking some huge risks and doing harm to the plumbing, gasfitting and drainlaying industry.

This is what Inland Revenue has to say:

While most people pay the right amount of tax, we know some people think they don't have to pay tax on cash jobs. Undeclared cash jobs take unfair advantage of honest businesses and cheat those who pay the right amount of tax.

It's okay to do jobs for cash or for your mates, as long as you declare the income in your tax return. You must: record every job, no matter how big or small, and provide your customers with receipts charge GST if you're registered for it. You must register for GST when your annual turnover exceeds \$60,000 declare all your income when you file your tax return.

If you're already paying tax on all your income, there's nothing more you need to do. If you're not doing the right thing we can help you get back on track.

If you've left some income off your tax return it's best to let us know now by making a full voluntary disclosure.

Know someone who's not playing fair? The entire community is affected when businesses cheat on their taxes. If you know someone who's doing undeclared cash jobs you can let us know anonymously using our Report tax crimes now service.

If you do this by using the form available please provide as much details as possible.

Taxes pay for services we all need, such as healthcare, education, environmental protection and recreation.

That was a nice friendly reminder from the IRD, but get caught and the process that will be followed won't be so friendly.

What it means is that you can get on and do training that is relevant to your daily employment without having to worry about collecting points.

Collecting points can now go in the bin along with the free cards collected with your groceries.

For those that haven't done the training we are told that it is due to go on line in October this year.

We have already heard businesses say they can now afford to get on and do training that is relevant and fun.

The Federation encourages you to develop training that meets your needs. It doesn't have to be a formal course in a room where you go to sleep.

Make it fun and in a format that gets the message across. If your staff walk away having only learnt one thing then it is still more than they knew when you started.

You may want to consider doing a train the trainer course or latch on to an ex services person who mostly have spent most of their careers training.

Make it relevant but make it fun.

The following invitation has been received from Master Plumbers We know a lot of tradespeople believe it is their given right to operate in a cash environment but it does have a detrimental effect on the rest of the industry in that it holds prices down. It simple, customers won't pay full rates for a tradesperson if they can get it done cheap through cashies!

The tradesperson takes all the risk for a gain, which they could get if their hourly rate was higher but their hourly rate won't go up because customers can get cheap jobs done, just a vicious circle.

We want your ideas to combat this situation. Remember it has to be fair to the employer as well as the employee. We are not so stupid that we think we can stop the problem totally but we sure can make improvements and leave the rest of the problem to the courts and discipline tribunals.

Wellington Master Plumbers are planning to run an evening on Gas Certification and identifying what is Hi/Low/General Risk Gasfitting.

Anthony Christenhusz from 'Worksafe' gave a presentation at last year's MP Conference, and another to Auckland plumbers earlier this year that was well received. 'Worksafe' are agreeable for him to do the same in Wellington.

In an effort to attract as many gasfitters as we can, we would like to know if your gas fitting members would find this informative, and if so, would you be able to give us a rough indication of numbers that might be keen?
